Assessments

No exams, but a weekly 1-2 page paper: either a critique of scholarship or an analysis of a play, which we then discuss in class.

Course Description:

Students will read all seven extant plays (including Antigone and Oedipus the King) fragmentary and one (Phaedra) of Athens' greatest dramatist, plus critical scholarship. An aristocrat, Sophocles' dramas performed to 17,000 Athenians are enmeshed in the problems and controversies of that city's democracy. What is the relationship of these texts to the democracy and to Athens' democratic leader Perikles, and how do their ideas change over time? Students will learn about one of the world's greatest dramatists and the world's first democracy, while improving their skills in writing, critical thinking, and debate. Grades are based on the weekly papers Attendance and class participation. mandatory.
