Course Description:

This advanced Latin course has two goals: (1) to explore the complex dynamic between Greece and Rome through translation, adaptation, and imitation in Latin poetry and (2) to practice producing literary translations sensitive to challenges of the intercultural communication that our study of Roman translation practices uncovers. Readings in Latin will range from ancient discussions of translation (e.g. Cicero's de Oratore, Horace's Ars *Poetica*), to passages based on Greek texts (Plautus' Bacchides, Catullus 51), to surveys of intertextual hotspots (the blush simile in epic). This course is ideal for advanced students who want to sharpen their understanding of Latin stylistics and lexical semantics while exploring the practical and theoretical concerns of translating in the past and present.
